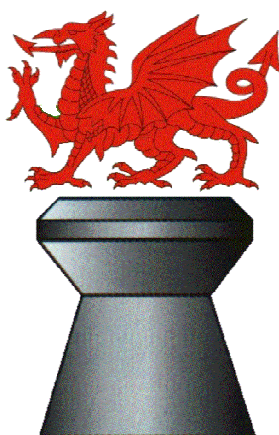

Course of fire

Megalink electronic targets will be used for all Classes and the Olympic Finals

60 shot competitions to be completed in 1 hour 15 minutes and 40 shot competitions to be completed in 50 minutes, all to be shot generally in accordance with the current ISSF Rules.

Disabled competitors are welcome and will be eligible to win class and aggregate competitions, but will not be entitled to the title of Open Championship Winner.

There will not be any separate Olympic Finals for disabled competitors.

Entered competitions may be shot in any order, by your squadding choice, e.g. Competition 2 may be shot before Competition 1.

N.B. Once you have received your Squadding notice you will have 24 hours to request a change in the squadding (i.e. change the order in which you wish to shoot the competitions), after this no changes to your squadding will be allowed, unless there are extenuating circumstances.

Special notice of withdrawal from match

In the event that a competitor's fired shots hit the electronic scoring target protection plate more than 2 times in a competition, the competitor will be deemed unsafe for that event and will have to withdraw. The score that they have fired for record will be entered into the results.

Competition Location

All competition will take place at the Gwyn Evans Leisure and Activity Centre, Wrexham, Heol Cefn, Gwersyllt, LL11 4HG. The Centre's web site is

Olympic Finals

The top eight Senior rifle, the top eight Junior rifle, the top eight Senior pistol and the top eight Junior pistol competitors will qualify for Olympic Finals.

The Finals have the following provisional start times on Sunday:-

Senior Rifle Final	1.15pm	Junior Rifle Final	2pm
Senior Pistol Final	2.45pm	Junior Pistol Final	3.30pm

The top eight for each Final will be decided by the leading 8 scores (in any Class) in Competition 1 shot up to and including Squad E (Sunday 9am) – **scores from Squad F (Sunday 11am) will not qualify**. In the event of tied scores, inner 10s will be used to decide the Finals places.

Please indicate “Yes” or “No” on the entry form as to whether you are available for the Olympic Final. If you have indicated “Yes” on the entry form and, for some reason, are no longer available, please let the Registration Desk know so that the lists can be altered.

Accommodation

There are many accommodation choices in and around Wrexham or a list is available from Ian Morris.

Random equipment control check

A number of competitors in Classes A and B of each competition on each day will be randomly selected to go through equipment control after they have finished shooting in that competition.

Clothing regulations

ISSF Rule 6.19.3.1 (Edition 2017 (First Print 01/2017)) is relaxed to allow blue jeans, jeans or similar trousers.

Please read the full rule to see what you may or not wear.

Cylinder dates

Dates of cylinders will be checked and suitable advice will be given if the cylinder is over 10 years old, but competitors will be allowed to compete at their own discretion.

Shot diagram printouts

Shot diagram printouts may be collected from the Registration Desk approximately 20 minutes after the end of each competition.

Mobile telephones

All mobile telephones should be turned OFF before entering the Sports Hall. Notices to this effect will be posted on the entrance doors to the Sports Hall and within the Sports Hall.

Receipts for entry fees

If you require a receipt for your entry fees, please tick the box on the entry form.

Compressed air

Compressed air will be available during the meeting. Please bring your own adapter that fits your rifle or pistol.

We cannot guarantee that compressed air will be available all weekend – it is possible that our air supply will run out during the weekend, so, if you are able to, please fill your cylinders with compressed air before travelling to the competition.

Teams

Competition 7 is for Teams of 3 in rifle and pistol. The competition is shot concurrently with Competition 1 with any three people forming a team (people do not have to come from the same Club).

Cost is £5 per team - one person pays and the Team Entry form is to be completed before any of the team has shot.

There is a Team Entry form on the reverse side of the individual entry form for the printed entry form or as the second page in the PDF entry form.

Equipment Control and the Registration Desk will have extra copies of the Team Entry forms.

Photographs and/or video will be taken at this event

By taking part in this event you grant the event organisers full rights to use the images resulting from the photography/video filming, and any reproductions or adaptations of the images for fundraising, publicity or other purposes to help achieve the Association's aims.

This might include (but is not limited to), the right to use them in printed and online publicity, social media, press releases and funding applications.
